REPLY IN SUPPORT OF PLAINTIFF'S MOTION FOR PROTECTIVE ORDER

Defendant's counsel engaged in improper and unprofessional conduct that prevented Plaintiff from being able to depose one of Defendant's expert witnesses. Defendant's counsel repeatedly made speaking objections, instructed the witness not to answer questions, coached the witness how to answer questions (or simply answered for the witness), made abusive comments to Plaintiff's counsel, and used profanity. In its response brief, Defendant largely admits that its counsel engaged in such conduct. The transcript of the abbreviated deposition, which the court reporter terminated after approximately 1.5 hours of questioning, reveals the extent of Defense counsel's obstruction. *See* Exhibit A. To prevent similar conduct in the future, Plaintiff requests that this Court enter a protective order and appoint Magistrate Judge Finnigan to supervise the remaining depositions.

I. <u>Instructing the Witness not to Answer</u>

Defendant admits that its counsel instructed the witness, Ayan Hasan, one of its expert witnesses, not to answer questions. Resp., ¶4. Defendant argues its counsel only gave the witness this instruction when a question had been asked and answered. First, "asked and answered" is not a valid basis for giving such an instruction. Fed. R. Civ. P. 30(c)(2); *Redwood v. Dobson*, 476 F.3d 462, 468-69 (7th Cir. 2007). Second, Defense counsel instructed the witness not to answer

questions for other—equally unjustified—reasons. For instance, Defense counsel instructed the witness not to answer questions because they "assumed facts not in evidence":

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Sir, were you aware that the oil pan had already been fixed by Dreyer and resealed by Dreyer & Reinbold when you did your inspection?

MR. BRODSKY: Objection.

MR. LUBIN: You can't make a speaking objection.

MR. BRODSKY: Objection. Assumes a fact not -- assumes a fact, so -- that's not in evidence. So don't -- don't answer the question.

Exhibit A, 49:9-18.

At one point, Defense counsel instructed the witness not to answer until Plaintiff's counsel explained the relevance of his question to Defense counsel:

Q. Yeah, okay. And are you aware that if you improperly seal an oil pan that that can void the factory warranty?

MR. BRODSKY: Objection. What's the relevance of that? Objection. What's the relevance of that? Don't answer.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Sir, are you aware of that?

MR. BRODSKY: What's the relevance of that?

MR. LUBIN: I'm not answering that. I'm not here to answer your question. We --

MR. BRODSKY: Okay. Then don't answer the question. If you can't explain the relevance, then --

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Will you answer the question, sir?

MR. BRODSKY: -- don't answer.

A. No, I won't answer the question.

Id. at 55:15-56:9.

At another point, Plaintiff's counsel attempted to probe the witness's memory of documents he had reviewed moments prior to the deposition. These documents detailed repairs made to the subject vehicle prior to the witness's inspection. Defense counsel refused to let the witness testify from memory and ordered the witness not to answer questions until Plaintiff's counsel agreed to first show the witness documents listing these repairs:

Q. Okay. Was the -- was the oil -- was the repair to the oil -- the resealing of the oil pan, was that done under warranty?

MR. BRODSKY: Show it to him, the documents --

MR. LUBIN: Well, I'm asking him. He's looked at -- he said he saw -- it was all --

MR. BRODSKY: No, you --

MR. LUBIN: It was all --

MR. BRODSKY: You -- he's not going to memorize a 12-page document.

MR. LUBIN: I'm not going to argue with you. I'm not --

MR. BRODSKY: So I'm not going to -- I'm going to tell him not to answer a question.

MR. LUBIN: Okay. Sure.

MR. BRODSKY: If you can show him the document, show him the document.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Sir, are you going to -- are you going to follow your lawyer's advice and not an -- the lawyer's advice and not answer the question?

A. Look, I don't remember. I'd -- I'd have to see.

MR. BRODSKY: He wants to see the document.

MR. LUBIN: Could you read back his testimony where he said the stuff wasn't covered under warranty?

MR. BRODSKY: You don't have to read it back. Look, it's not a guessing game. If you want to show him it was covered under warranty. He didn't memorize a 12-page document in one -- by looking at it one time. Okay? So what was covered under warranty, was covered under warranty; and what wasn't, wasn't. If you want to ask about a specific thing, show him the document and ask him. It's not a guessing game.

MR. LUBIN: Okay. This is --

MR. BRODSKY: It's not a memory test.

MR. LUBIN: This is coaching. You're --

MR. BRODSKY: No, it's not.

MR. LUBIN: -- supposed to object as to form, and you're not supposed to instruct him not to --

MR. BRODSKY: I'm telling --

MR. LUBIN: -- answer the question --

MR. BRODSKY: -- telling you on the proper way to take a deposition. So if you want to ask him a question that he -- about his document, show him the document.

Id. at 15:16-17:8.

Several times during the deposition, Defense counsel instructed the witness not to answer questions that Defense counsel deemed "misleading":

- Q. (By Mr. Lubin) So does that refresh your recollection that you didn't look at the Manheim condition report in conjunction with preparing your report?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. And you never saw the Manheim condition report until you looked at it at your deposition today; correct?
 - A. Correct.
- Q. And if you haven't looked at it and you don't know what's in there, you can't give an opinion whether it's true or false; correct?

MR. BRODSKY: Objection. That's -- objection. That's improper. He can give an opinion if he -- after he looks at it, if whether or not it's true or false.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Sir, are you giving an opinion as to whether that's true or false?

MR. BRODSKY: No, that's -- objection. He hasn't looked at it, so he can't give an opinion.

MR. LUBIN: Okay.

MR. BRODSKY: That's a misleading question. Don't answer it.

MR. LUBIN: Okay.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Will you answer the question, sir?

MR. BRODSKY: No, he's not answering the question. It's a misleading question.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Sir --

MR. BRODSKY: The type of baloney that you've engaged in through this entire case. He said he never looked at it, so how can he give an opinion about it. So he's not going to say he can't give an opinion about it so you can misquote it in your response to the Summary Judgment Motion. That's not what he's saying.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Sir, do you know whether the Manheim report is true or false?

MR. BRODSKY: Objection. He can't -- he never looked at it, so how can he know? He already said he never looked at it.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Will you answer the question, please, sir?

MR. BRODSKY: No, don't answer the misleading question.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Will you answer the question, sir?

MR. BRODSKY: No, he's not answering –

A. I won't answer the question.

Id. at 86:6-88:6; *see also id.* at 100:2-103:14; *id.* at 103:15-105:1.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Sir, were you aware that the hood split apart in the accident?

MR. BRODSKY: No.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Yes or no?

MR. BRODSKY: Don't answer that answer that question.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Can you answer the question?

MR. BRODSKY: It's a misleading question.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Can you answer that question, sir?

A. No.

MR. BRODSKY: No, don't answer that question.

Id. at 116:2-20.

Other times, Defense counsel instructed the witness not to answer based on an improper asked and answered objection:

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Were you aware when you -- when you dropped the oil pan that Mr. Twyman had already had it resealed on November 19 --

MR. BRODSKY: Objection.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) -- 2015?

MR. BRODSKY: Asked and answered.

THE COURT REPORTER: 2015?

MR. LUBIN: Yes.

THE COURT REPORTER: Thank you.

MR. BRODSKY: Objection. Answered and answered. He already answered he didn't know about anything done with the oil pan before.

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Will you answer the question, sir?

MR. BRODSKY: Don't repeat the question --

Q. (By Mr. Lubin) No, you won't answer the question?

A. No, I won't answer the question.

MR. BRODSKY: Stop. You've already answered it. He doesn't know if anybody had anything to -- if the pan was dropped and resealed before. He doesn't know. He already said that.

MR. LUBIN: I don't want your testimony. I want his --

MR. BRODSKY: Well, you already have his testimony.

Id. at 56:10-57:12; see also id. at 52:7-53:10.

Regardless of whether the question had been asked and answered, Defense counsel deemed the question misleading, or any of the other proffered excuses for giving the instruction to the witness. The instruction was improper. *See* Fed. R. Civ. P. 30(c)(2) ("An objection... must be noted on the record, but *the examination still proceeds; the testimony is taken subject to any objection.*" (emphasis added)). Defendant argues that the instruction was proper because it filed its own motion for a protective order under Rule 30(d)(3) after the deposition. Defendant, however, did not terminate the deposition after giving the instruction not to answer in order to bring a motion under Rule 30(d)(3). Defendant gave the instruction, the deposition continued, then later Defendant filed its motion. Defense counsel should be ordered not to give the witness such an instruction, except for the reasons set forth in Rule 30.

II. Speaking Objections and Coaching the Witness.

Numerous times during the deposition, Defense counsel improperly interjected himself into the questioning of the witness. Defense counsel interfered with the deposition by coaching the witness and suggesting answers to him:

Q. So you don't -- so you don't have an opinion whether or not the steering column was damaged in the accident; correct, sir?

MR. BRODSKY: Wait, wait. Wait, wait. He asked -- you're assuming -- first, it assumes -- he doesn't know whether or not it was ever repaired because he told you he didn't look at anything before he did his examination. So that question's misleading. And it's already been asked and answered. His opinion is -- in the written opinion, he says the car was in a -- was in a very -- was a slow speed, front and --

MR. LUBIN: Well, here you go -- here you go coaching again.

MR. BRODSKY: -- fender bender --

A. No, I put that in there.

MR. BRODSKY: I'm not coaching him. That's his report.

MR. LUBIN: Yeah, I understand that's his report.

MR. BRODSKY: So that's -- so now, are you ask -- so you're asking him if a steering column could be damaged in a front and slender bender? Is that what you're asking him? Because your question is misleading.

MR. LUBIN: No, that's not what I'm asking him.

MR. BRODSKY: Okay. So --

MR. LUBIN: Now you're telling him what to say --

MR. BRODSKY: No, I'm not. And I'm trying to make --

MR. LUBIN: You actually are.

MR. BRODSKY: I'm trying to understand your --

MR. LUBIN: And it's --

MR. BRODSKY: -- question.

MR. LUBIN: You actually are. And it's --

MR. BRODSKY: No. One, it's a --

MR. LUBIN: -- and it's really not, sir.

MR. BRODSKY: -- misleading question. You're asking a misleading question.

MR. LUBIN: All right. We're going to be going to the Court for a protective order soon.

MR. BRODSKY: I -- right, right, whatever. You're going -- look it -- look, you've -- you're asking misleading questions. You have his opinion in front of you that says it was at a slow speed. Now you're asking him --

Id. at 112:2-114:1; *see also id.* at 69:8-70:13 (Defense counsel takes over the questioning of the witness during Plaintiff's examination); 81:3-82:17; 96:22-98:13; 99:9-100:1.

- Q. (By Mr. Lubin) Oh, here's the witness's copy. Here you go. Sir, if you look at -- if you look at Exhibit 7B, sir, PROG -- PROG067. Do you see that? They're right in order, so if -- you can go to 67.
 - A. I need glasses. Now I'm here. Okay. What about this page?
 - Q. Did you ever see that picture before making your report?

MR. BRODSKY: Objection. He's already said he didn't see any pictures of the accident.

A. I told you I didn't see –

Id. at 134:23-135:10.

- Q. And if you look at the next page, PROG068, did you see that the car had been dented in the back in the collision, that picture?
 - A. Do I see this picture now?

- Q. Yes.
- A. I see it now.
- Q. Did you -- did you see that when you made your report?

MR. BRODSKY: Objection. He already said he didn't see anything. You don't have to keep asking that question a thousand times.

A. I already answered.

Id. at 135:24-136:11; *see also id.* at 140:24-141:15; 142:2-142:18; 169:10-15; 170:21-171:10.

At other times, Defense counsel interfered with Plaintiff's counsel's questions by

showing the witness documents or photographs to suggest answers to the witness:

- Q. Are you sure that crack is not still there today?
- A. I can't be 100 percent sure, but I don't think so. I don't -- I -- I'd have to look through my pictures again to see if the picture picked it up, but I --
 - Q. But you don't have any pictures of that part of the car, do you?

MR. BRODSKY: Well, he looked at other pictures though.

- Q. (By Mr. Lubin) You looked at other pictures?
- A. Yeah, these. These.
- Q. Okay. Show me if that part of the car, if there's any photograph of that. In the 49 pictures attached to your report, if there's any pictures of the same area as PROG029?

MR. BRODSKY: Well, here, here.

MR. LUBIN: Well, Mr. Brodsky, you're not supposed to be taking the exhibit and showing him what to look at. Let the record reflect that instead of the witness looking at the documents on his own, that Mr. Brodsky is looking at them, pointing at them, telling him what to look at, which is not proper.

Id. at 144:9-145:9.

- Q. Okay. Now, do you mind if I point? You see how the bumper guard covers up the surface of the crush plate?
 - A. Okay.
- Q. So you can't look at the surface of the crush plate where the bumper guard attaches to that without removing the bumper guard; correct?
 - A. Yes.
- MR. BRODSKY: Objection. Asked and answered. Wait a second. We've got a picture of that.

(WHEREUPON, discussion was had off the record.)

MR. LUBIN: I don't want you to be showing the witness --

MR. BRODSKY: Because you're telling him something that --

MR. LUBIN: I'm not tell -- I'm not telling him anything. I'm showing him one picture and asking him a question.

MR. BRODSKY: No. You were --

MR. LUBIN: Okay. You and your client are not supposed to be showing the witness photographs of --

MR. BRODSKY: Well, then don't -- you are misrepresenting something.

MR. LUBIN: No. There --

MR. BRODSKY: You asked him if there was a picture, and there is.

MR. LUBIN: No, I didn't ask him that --

MR. BRODSKY: Yes, you did.

MR. LUBIN: -- and now you guys are coaching him, you and Mohammed.

MR. BRODSKY: No. I'm showing him a picture where you can see from underneath the surface of the crush plate.

Id. at 67:8-68:17.

As the transcript reveals, Defense counsel did not show the witness photographs only "to help the witness find the picture that the Plaintiff's attorney was asking him about," contrary to what Defendant argues in its response. Resp., ¶8.

Twice during the deposition, Defense counsel told the witness to "quit babbling" when he thought the witness was saying too much or not saying the right thing:

- Q. No. I'm talking about when -- in your -- when you looked at the car, did you determine that the front cover had been repaired in the front where it had been cracked here as shown in PROG83? Did you know that?
- A. No. I was -- wait a second. I don't remember, but I'm pretty sure it was -- so it was replaced? I don't even -- I don't know. I -- I -- I would have to look at my report. I don't remember.
 - Q. So you don't know if the bumper cover was repaired or replaced; correct?
 - A. I think it was replaced. I'd have to look at it. I don't know.
 - Q. So it's your opinion the bumper --

MR. BRODSKY: -- you don't know?

THE WITNESS: I don't remember.

MR. BRODSKY: Well, then say you don't know. Quit babbling, man.

THE WITNESS: All right. I'm --

MR. LUBIN: But you're not allowed to tell him to quit babbling and tell him, say you don't know. That's not proper.

MR. BRODSKY: Well, I didn't say don't – I said don't – just answer the question.

MR. LUBIN: No, you're not allowed to tell him what to say.

MR. BRODSKY: I can tell him not to babble and just answer the question.

MR. LUBIN: You can't tell him anything.

MR. BRODSKY: Yes, I can.

MR. LUBIN: You can object as to forms of the question. Not tell him anything about how he's answering the question.

MR. BRODSKY: He's babbling. Just answer the question.

Id. at 138:9-139:20; see also id. at 154:8-155:13.

Later, Defense counsel removed the witness from the deposition in order to conference with him about the deposition. Defense counsel admitted on the record that the conference with the witness was about the deposition and Plaintiff's counsel's questions. *Id.* at 117:1-119:2. When Plaintiff's counsel attempted to question the witness about what the witness and defense counsel talked about during the conference, Defense counsel refused to let the witness answer the questions and threatened to terminate the deposition if Plaintiff's counsel asked about the discussions during the conference. *Id.* at 119:3-121:10.

When Plaintiff's counsel objected to Defense counsel's speaking objections and conferences with the witness, Defense counsel insisted that he was entitled to make speaking objections, *id.* at 19:13-15, and conference with the witness during the deposition about his testimony, *id.* at 117:1-121:10. Defense counsel was wrong on both accounts. *Hall v. Clifton Precision*, 150 F.R.D. 525, 528, 529 n.7 (E.D. Pa. 1993).

III. <u>Accusing Plaintiff's Counsel of Being a Liar and Running a Criminal</u> Enterprise and Using Profanity

As explained in Plaintiff's motion, Defense counsel repeatedly directed abusive and insulting language at Plaintiff's counsel. *See, e.g.*, **Exhibit A** at 71 (calling Plaintiff's counsel a liar); 122 (accusing Plaintiff's counsel of running a criminal enterprise), 170 ("Quit asking these worthless, ridiculous questions and get to something that actually means something."). Although Defendant attempts to downplay Defense counsel's "criminal enterprise" comment by arguing that he made it in a private conversation, the transcript reveals that Defense counsel made the comment on the record and later bragged about making the comment and the fact that he was not trying to hide it from the record. *Id.* at 125:3-17 ("Get this one down too. You keep putting it [the 'criminal enterprise' comment] in there [the record] like I'm trying to hide it. I've said it in

writing."). The transcript also reveals that Defense counsel used profanity on the record twice

during the deposition. Id. at 58, 73.

As the attached transcript reveals, Defense counsel's conduct was improper and

interfered with Plaintiff's counsel's ability to question Mr. Hasan. Without a protective order,

Defense counsel is likely to interfere with future depositions in a similar manner. Accordingly,

Plaintiff requests that this Court grant his motion for a protective order and appoint Magistrate

Judge Finnigan to supervise the remaining depositions.
